MINUTES OF ESCRICK PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT 7.30PM IN ESCRICK VILLAGE CLUB ON MONDAY 2ND OCTOBER 2017

17174: Apologies/Attendance:

- **a.** Present: Cllrs Rowson, Coulson, Luscombe, Moran, Rees, Forster, Councell and County Cllr Musgrave.
- **b.** Apologies: Apologies were received from Cllrs Cunningham, Morley-Jones and M Casling; in addition, Dist Cllr L Casling and the Clerk. It was resolved to accept reasons from Parish Councillors.
- c. The Attendance book was not available for signature.

17175: Interests: Chair reminded members to make any declarations of interest in any agenda items.

17176: Welcome: Chair welcomed Councillors and visitors to the meeting.

17177: Minutes

- a. It was resolved to accept Minutes of the meeting held on 4th September 2017.
- b. Chairman signed minutes as a true record.

17178: Council received comments on agenda items or other questions/comments from electors present. Items received by the Clerk since the last meeting:

1. See item 17188.3. below. A resident raised concerns about the speed and volume of traffic on Skipwith Road and queried what the Parish Council could do about it. The Chair provided a brief history of recent attempts to address traffic issues in the village and note that Skipwith Road is a Speed Camera Van location. A vehicle activated speed sign (VAS) could be a possibility. These cost around £6000 outright, or NYCC have a scheme whereby for £1.5k per annum, a sign could be installed and removed periodically (18 weeks per annum) - including all Officer time and Highways permissions. It was suggested that this be considered as part of the annual budget discussions.

17182: Neighbourhood Plan:

1. Working Group to gave update.

2. Noted that SDC have advertised a 'Notice of Consultation for Designation of a Neighbourhood Area' to take place between 14th September and 26th October. Update provided – next steps obtaining consultants quotes, ahead of applying for funding./

17183: Plasmor Planning Application to extract clay: Councillors to reported on site meeting to discuss quarrying plans: the following was noted:

Update provided:

- M&W plan covered largest area as there were uncertainties as to where best to quarry

- Plans have been refined to focus on most feasible areas, slightly smaller than M&W plan
- Plans now include additional access road to Stillingfleet Rd, so as not to cross the cycleway
- Would be phased use of the site with phased restoration
- Don't foresee a change in volumes than Hemmingbrough constraint is the kilns
- 200k tonnes per annum extraction, estimate 25 years supply
- 50 in/ 50 out HGV movements per day, plus any vehicles bringing waste for restoration
- Restoration likely to be a mix of water bodies, wetland and back to agriculture
- 7am 5pm working mon fri, 7am 1pm Sat
- Planning permission submit late 2018
- Decision late 2019
- Commence 2021

Key concerns include:

- Traffic, extra vehicles for extraction and in-fill?
- What sort of restoration would happen in practice e.g. could become a household waste site?
- What is to stop the applicant failing in their restoration obligations (e.g. like North Selby mine site)?

17184: Street Lighting:

1. Cllr Rowson reported regarding the possibility of mounting a light on an existing electricity post at the bus stop outside the Business Park: The Business Park residents not willing to fund. Agreed to carry forward to next month's preliminary budget discussions

17185: Autumn Village Tidy-Up: Cllrs Councell and Morley-Jones reported on arrangements made for carrying out an Autumn Tidy-Up on Saturday 11th November. Cllr Councell to provide advert for Parish Magazine and liaise with SDC regarding bin provision.

17186: Councillor Vacancy: Noted that the vacancy is open for co-option. Cllr Rowson to repeat advert in Parish Magazine and website.

17187: Grass Cutting Contract: It was resolved to proceed with the invitation to tender as documented.

17188: Highways Issues:

1. Possibility of a pedestrian crossing on the A19. Awaiting update from Cllr Musgrave

2. Parking on Carr Lane and Main Street at School start/finish times: whilst the School has issued parking information to parents, the problem is continuing. The yellow lines and zig zags are usually clear, but parking on Carr Lane where there are double white lines reduces the road to single lane. The police are in the process of confirming the precise details of the restriction on Carr Lane, with a view to issuing warning letters initially and then enforcement which could lead to large fines and points on a driving licence. Noted.

3. A complaint was received regarding speeding vehicles on Skipwith Road. The resident noted that the Police camera van attends the site, but requested that a VAS (Vehicle Activated Sign) be considered. See above.
